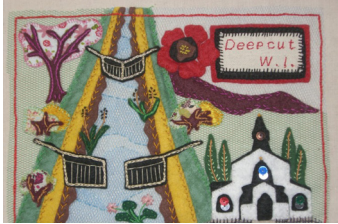

The Deepcut Spring Clean on May 4th was a huge success! A Moveable Feast

Surrey Heath is entering Hampton Court Flower Show this year. The garden entry has been designed by Kate Turner at Flourish Community Garden and a group of local volunteer Army wives from Deepcut. It is a fantastic project and the idea for the garden came about after the army wives attended a 'grow your own veg' course at Flourish. They wanted cheap and easy ways to grow things that could then be moved and relocate with them. So the theme 'A Moveable Feast' was designed. The garden will feature lots of different edible plants and is a celebration of eating together.

All of the planting is 'moveable' and will be relocated back to the community when Hampton Court Flower Show is finished.



Another key theme of the garden is that we will have used army boots around the perimeter which will be planted with yellow calendulas symbolising the yellow ribbon of hope.

It's such a fantastic project as it has come completely from a real need within the community! It has been designed by Kate and the Army Wives and is supported by Surrey Heath Borough Council.
